## SPIRITUAL NUTRITION PLAN

Forming habits takes time and intentionality. It is also important to set realistic goals and use them as stepping stones to where you want to be. This month try adding one of these to your routine:

- Spend time in prayer for 15 minutes one day a week
- If you aren't used to this, your brain will likely wander. Part of forming this habit is being gentle with yourself, and working towards focusing on God in this time.
- Pick one day a week and spend
   time in your Bible for 15 minutes
- There is so much in the Bible that we often leave reading it for Sundays because we don't know where to start. The good news is that each book has something to offer! Try Mark, John or James to start your new habit.

- \* Look for a fellowship opportunity once a month
- Alone time with God is important and so is time among our brothers and sisters in Christ. Outside of Sunday worship, check community churches' calendars for an oppor-

tunity to experience the Kingdom.

- 3+ times a year look for a volunteer opportunity
- We are called to be the "hands and feet" of Christ. We need to reach out into our community to be walking and talking witnesses of the Gospel. This can be in our day to day lives, but vol-

unteering is often a unique and humbling experience that shakes us out of our routines. Check community calendars and organizations such as *Habitat for Humanity* for opportunities.

Remember to start small and build! Pick one and try it for a while, then you can toss another one into your routine.



# CHRISTIAN EDUCATION CELEBRATING GOD'S LOVE



Celebrating God's love is a time for joy. In times of trouble/sadness/despair etc. we, as Christians, have the knowledge that God's love never leaves us. And joy is in knowing that!

Did you know there are 214 Bible verses that speak to joy? A definition of joy is "the great emotion of great delight or happiness that is caused by something exceptionally good or satisfying". This can be fleeting but for us the joy that God gives us is eternal. The Bible never promises us happiness but does promise us joy. Happiness may be temporary and based upon what is happening. Joy is from the Lord, and we can experience God given joy even when we may be experiencing trials, suffering or testing. Joy from God is permanent.

Psalm 126:3 "The Lord has done great things for us and we are filled with joy." Joy is one of the fruits of the spirit (Galatians 5). Jack Wellman, a pastor in Kansas has written extensively about Bible verses on joy and identified what he calls the top 7 verses. Hebrews 12:2; James1:2-3; 1 Peter 1:8-9; John 16:22; 1 Thessalonians 2:19-20; Psalm 28:7 and Isaiah 12:6. They all speak to me at different times but for the purposes of this article I chose, Psalm 28:7. "The Lord is my strength and my shield: my heart trusts in Him and He helps me. My heart leaps for joy and with my song I praise Him".

When I think of you, the people of this congregation, I praise God and thank Him for each of you. You take God's joy to so many and my prayer is you always feel the joy from God. What a joy it is to join you in worship, fellowship, studying Scripture, praying and caring for others. What a joy to know you are available for helping promote spiritual growth and unity in Christ. As the hymn says, "They Will Know We Are Christians by Our Love" and that love should radiate joy on our faces.

#### Thoughts:

Worshiping together brings strength and joy.

Focus on joy not happiness.

**Question:** Does your face radiate God's love and

joy?

**Prayer:** God, I thank you for each member of this church family and pray each one always feels surrounded by your love and joy. Amen

Challenge: Go and take JOY!


